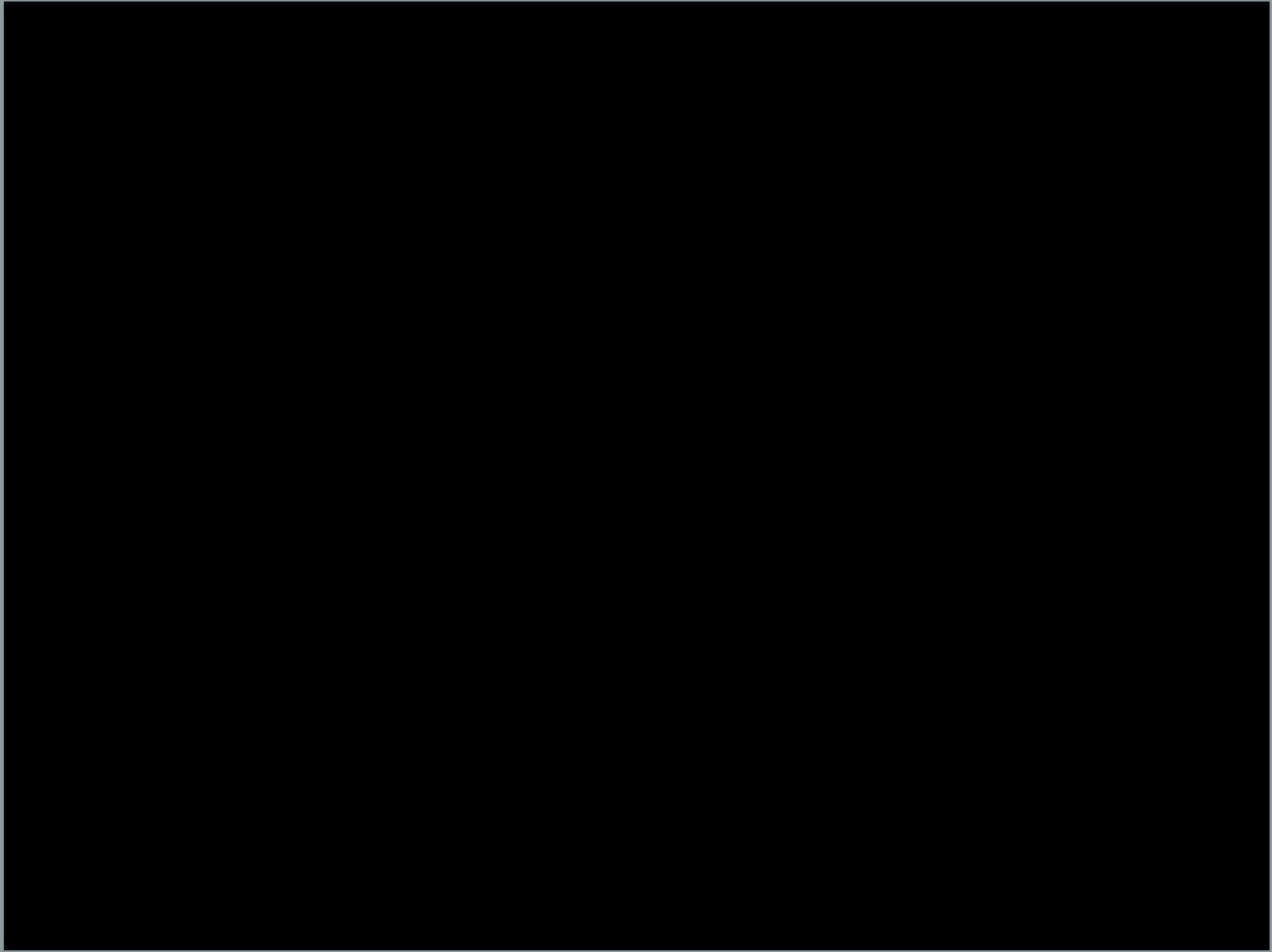

Sodium Regulations

School Breakfast Program & National School Lunch Program Sodium Timeline & Limits

This action follows the April 13th federal district court ruling that vacated the 2018 final rule regarding these flexibilities, citing procedural issues.

The proposed rule maintains Target 1 sodium limits through SY 2023 - 24.

School Breakfast Program:

- K - 5th (less than or equal to) 540 Target 1
- 6th - 8th (less than or equal to) 600 Target 1
- 9th - 12th (less than or equal to) 640 Target 1

National School Lunch Program:

- K - 5th (less than or equal to) 1,230 Target 1
- 6th - 8th (less than or equal to) 1,360 Target 1
- 9th - 12th (less than or equal to) 1,420 Target 1

Target 2 limits take effect in SY 2024 - 25, and the final target is eliminated.

School Breakfast Program:

- K - 5th (less than or equal to) 485 Target 2
- 6th - 8th (less than or equal to) 535 Target 2
- 9th - 12th (less than or equal to) 570 Target 2

National School Lunch Program:

- K - 5th (less than or equal to) 935 Target 2
- 6th - 8th (less than or equal to) 1,035 Target 2
- 9th - 12th (less than or equal to) 1,080 Target 2

The rule requires half of all grains served in the NSLP/SBP to be whole grain-rich and allows service of low-fat flavored milk.




Lee Angela Reid, Partner

Lee Angela has served as the Senior Legislative Advocate since the firm was founded in 2012, after spending 23 years in the State Capitol working on K-12 education issues. Previously, Ms. Reid served as a consultant on state and federal education issues in the Senate Office of Research, providing analysis and advice to legislators and legislative staff on K-12 education policy issues and trends. Lee Angela also acted as a key liaison between legislators, the State Board of Education, California Department of Education, universities, and think tanks. In this role, she has developed a reputation as one of the most prominent experts on policy, waivers, and curriculum and instruction issues pending before the State Board of Education. Additionally, in her role at the Senate Office of

Research, Ms. Reid provided professional development opportunities to her legislative staff colleagues. Previously, Ms. Reid served as the K-14 education consultant to the Vice-Chair of the Senate Education Committee, Senator Bruce McPherson from 2001 to 2004. She is a graduate of UC Davis with bachelor degrees in International Relations and Spanish.
