## Generating By-in from Stakeholders



### Generating Buy-in with Stakeholders

- Superintendent has a lot of power over educational staff
  - ▶ If you have his/her support, you can advertise in meeting announcements
  - ► Learn the Superintendent's motivations
- Share current fitness gram and obesity rates in your district with extended cabinet or principal's meeting
- Set up Wellness Committee meeting to celebrate successes!!
  - Perception is on the eye of the beholder
- Promote wellness efforts at events where parents are present
  - Do your homework to find out what schools/departments are doing and spread the word!!
  - Examples include: school gardens, Harvest of the Month, Dairy Council, walking clubs, jog-a-thons, salad/garden bars, meal pattern requirements, PBIS, & more...



## Scheduling and Organizing your Committee/Council

- Schedule of Meetings
  - Coordinate with Learning and Teaching
  - Send reminders with meeting agenda
  - Generate donations or raffles for added interest
  - Quarterly or bi-annual vs. monthly meetings

- Committee
  - Request additional point person from sites
  - Recruit local partners who can provide support to schools
  - Follow best-practice models whenever possible (Coordinated School Health)

## OMSD Local School Wellness Policy Revision



- ► The Wellness Policy is guidance for schools required as of 2004 by the Child Nutrition WIC Reauthorization Act
  - ▶ 2010 Revision reflects Healthy, Hungry-free Kids Act revised requirements
  - ➤ 2013 Revision reflects new potable water requirements
  - ➤ 2015 Revise to illustrate wellness efforts in the district, strengthen language to promote consistent health messages, provide clear guidance to schools





#### Local School Wellness Policies (LWP): Comparison Chart of 2004 vs. 2010 Requirements

	2004 Requirements Child Nutrition WIC	2010 Requirements
	Reauthorization Act	Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act
Overview	Directs local educational agencies (LEAs) to have a LWP in place for each school under its jurisdiction.	Strengthens LWPs and adds requirements for public participation, transparency, and implementation.
Elements of the Local School Wellness Policy	LWP to include, at a minimum, goals for nutrition education, physical activity, and other school-based activities to promote student wellness, as well as nutrition guidelines for all foods available on school campus.	In addition to the 2004 requirements, the LWP is also to include goals for nutrition promotion.
Stakeholder Involvement	LEAs are required to involve parents, students, and representatives of the school food authority, the school board, school administrators, and the public in the development of LWP.	In addition to the 2004 requirements, LEAs are now required to permit teachers of physical education and school health professionals to participate in the development of LWP.
Stakeholder Participation	The stakeholders named above are required to participate in the development of the LWP.	In addition to the 2004 requirements, LEAs are now required to permit all stakeholders named above and in 2004 to participate in the implementation and periodic review and update of LWP.
Local Discretion	LEAs can determine the specific policies appropriate for the schools under their jurisdiction, provided that those policies include all required elements specified in the Act.	Same as 2004 requirement.

### Public Input and Engagement Cont.

- Meet with student council at various school sites to assess awareness of wellness policy
- Share highlights presentation with administrators and partners to spread the word with other staff and parents
- Conduct additional survey assessment such as School Health Index and/or adapted questionnaires (surveymonkey works best) to validate needs
- Discuss barriers and possible strategies to overcome barriers with students, parents, and staff

#### Ontario-Montclair SD BP 5030 Students Student Wellness

The Board of Trustees recognizes the link between student health and learning and desires to provide a comprehensive program promoting healthy eating and physical activity for district students. Superintendent or designee shall build a coordinated school health system that supports and reinforces health literacy through health education, physical education, health services, nutrition services, psychological and counseling services, health promotion for staff, a safe and healthy school environment, and parent/guardian and community involvement. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall develop strategies for promoting staff wellness and for involving parents/guardians and the community in reinforcing students' understanding and appreciation of the importance of a healthy lifestyle.

#### I. District Wellness Committee

To fulfill this requirement, the Superintendent or designee may appoint a District Wellness Council or other district committee whose membership shall include representatives of these groups. He/she may also invite participation of other groups or individuals, such as health curriculum directors, counselors, before- and after- school program staff health practitioners, partner agencies, and/or others interested in school health issues.

The District Wellness Council committee shall advise the district on health-related issues, activities, policies, and programs. At the discretion of the Superintendent or designee, the duties
